Program Admission Requirements

Must have **completed first year** of your Grado (**60 ECTS**) before start of program

Enrolled as a full-time undergraduate student at your university

Have an upper intermediate level of English: **B2, TOEFL iBT 80, IELTS 6.5 or Duolingo 100.**

Remember that test results are only valid for up to 2 years.

If you have not taken an exam, UCR will send your a "code" to take the Duolingo exam online free of charge after you apply.


Anthem Blue Cross and Health Insurance.

Interested in applying for January 2026?

Get started now.

The applications open mid-September, but there is a lot you can do now

- 1. Request your official **Academic Record.**
- 2. Prepare the UCR application **Essay**. One page, double spaced. Answer the following questions and provide as much details as you can:
- a) What is your goal for the University of California program?
- b) How does this program relate to your academic and career goals?
- c) Can you describe how the academic work and training will benefit you, your university and your country?
- Prepare your CV/ResumePage

- 4. Are your parents in agreement? If needed, get in contact with **Caixabank** or your own bank for financial support for the initial/up front costs.
- 5. Ensure your **Passport** is valid and up-to-date. You will need a passport that if valid for the duration of your studies in the US. (Program dates: January 12-July 9.)
- 6. Do you have an official **English language level**?

Remember exam results are valid **only 2 years**. You can take the Duolingo online and will get your results in about 48 hours.
