The panel professors will be appointed by the Department Directors. Each Bachelor's Degree Final Project will be graded calculating the arithmetic average of the different grades issued by each member of the panel. Each panel member will have a specific section to do so. The student will have 15 minutes for the oral defense of the project, after which s/he will answer the questions of the members of the panel, should there be any.
