

SUPERVISED PRACTICUM

- The **Bachelor's Degree in Pharmacy** is regulated by Order CIN/2137/2008, which establishes the requirements for the accreditation of official university degrees qualifying graduates to practice as pharmacists (BOE, 20/11/2008).
- **Supervised Internships** may be carried out in a community pharmacy open to the public and/or in a hospital under the supervision of its Pharmacy Service (Directive 85/432/EEC; Directive 2005/36/EC; Directive 2013/55/EU).
- The internships must be completed over a **minimum continuous period of 6 months**.
- Internships may only be undertaken in pharmacies that are part of existing agreements between CEU San Pablo University and the Official Colleges of Pharmacists in Spain, or in Hospital Pharmacy Services that have a current agreement with the University. Our pharmacies undergo annual audits and comply with Good Pharmacy Practice (GPP).
- The duration of the internship will be **six months**, during which a minimum of **800 training hours** must be completed, of which at least **700 hours** must be in community or hospital pharmacy. These internships are organized throughout the semester according to the Faculty's agreed calendar.
- There are **two internship periods per academic year** (as with any subject): from February to July and from September to February. This structure is designed to align with the 5th-year curriculum, concentrating most coursework in the first semester to reduce the academic workload in the second semester and allow internships to be completed without interference.
- Allocation of placements in community or hospital pharmacy will be based on a **weighted average of academic record and number of credits passed**.
- All students undertaking supervised internships must complete a **preliminary course** jointly organized by the University and the Official College of Pharmacists of Madrid (held in February and September). They must also attend the training sessions organized by CEU in collaboration with professionals.

- Once internships have begun, students may only **change pharmacy during the first month**, and only if there is a duly justified and proven reason (for example, a clear incompatibility between the tutor and the student, acknowledged by both parties).

ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENTS

1. Have passed **AT LEAST 246 TOTAL CREDITS** of the Pharmacy degree (including elective courses).
2. Have completed the following courses: **“Clinical Pharmacy,” “Pharmacology and Pharmacotherapy,” “General Pharmacology,” “Pharmaceutical Care,” and “Pharmaceutical Technology 3.”**
3. Students may enroll in a **maximum of 24 credits**, in addition to the **PRACTICUM**.
